## **COCKTAIL RECIPES**

### COCKTAIL #1

#### THE MONTGOMERY

2 OZ CRANBERY-ORANGE-CINNAMON-GINGER SYRUP 1.5 OZ VODKA

POUR ALL INGREDIANTS INTO COCKTAIL SHAKER SHAKE UNTIL COLD, ABOUT 30 SECONDS STRAIN INTO A GLASS WITH FRESH ICE TOP WITH SODA WATER OR SPRITE

ALSO TRY THIS WITH YOUR FAVORITE GIN

<u>TO MAKE THE SYRUP</u> 2 CUPS WHOLE CRANBERRIES 1/4 CUP OF OJ 1/4 CUP WATER 1/4 CUP SUGAR CINNAMON AND GINGER TO TASTE

IN A MEDIUM POT, BRING WATER, OJ AND SUGAR TO A BOIL UNTIL ALL THE SUGAR IS DISSOLVED ADD RINSED CRANBERRIES AND BRING TO BOIL

LOWER TEMPERATURE TO SIMMER UNTIL CRANBERRIES BURST (APPROX 10 MINUTES) ADD CINNAMON AND/OR GINGER TO TASTE

**PRO TIP** ADD ORANGE RIND/ZEST IN WITH CRANBERRIES TO ENHANCE ORANGE FLAVOR

#### **OL'NORTH POLE HOT CHOCOLATE**

1 PACKET OF YOUR FAVORITE HOT CHOCOLATE MIX 1.5 OZ BOURBON (TRY CROWN ROYAL VANILLA) 0.5 OZ PEPPERMINT SCHNAPPS 8-10 OZ OF HOT WATER OR MILK

MAKE HOT CHOCOLATE WITH WATER OR MILK ADD IN BOURBON AND PEPPERMINT SCHNAPPS SPRINLW WITH CINNAMON IF DESIRED





Agnès Artemel – Agnès has lived in Old Town North for more than 20 years (at the Rivergate townhouses) and in Alexandria neighborhoods for a total of more than 40 years. She has served on the NOTICe Board for four years.Her professional work focuses on urban planning, real estate, and economic development.
