NOTICe Updates

This summer your NOTICe Board took stock of our OTN Small Area Plan (SAP) progress. There were lots of projects in the first five years of the 25-year plan. We've seen rapid growth in housing and retail, but we've lost office jobs. The OTN SAP public benefit goals of 9 acres of new public parks and increased green, open space, affordable housing and an arts/cultural corridor are lagging.

The market trend is to convert office and hotel buildings to residential. We recently reviewed the Trans Potomac offices to <u>Tide Lock residences</u> plan. New mid-high rise residences and town homes are now coming into view at the Muse and Venue (along the Mount Vernon Trail), Abingdon Row and the Alexan (Bus Barn).

As OTN becomes more residential, NOTICe is focused on achieving the Public & Open Space, Affordability and Mobility goals of the Plan. We need safer, more pedestrian and bike friendly streets; increased tree canopy and open space; improved vistas and pedestrian access to our waterfront parks and Mt Vernon Trail for active residents. In concert with the OTN Community Partnership, we advocate a pause now on any new arts height/density bonuses to conduct a user survey to guide the Arts & Culture District. We'll be sending out a public survey soon.

It's time to safely re-connect and see some of <u>these developments</u> and hear your ideas. You can also see new project presentations at <u>UDAC</u> on September 8th and join NOTICe members on Thursday, September 23rd for site visits and a Member gathering at St. Elmo's. MetroStage Launches Capital Campaign

With the conversion of the Crowne Plaza hotel to condos almost complete, MetroStage is making plans for the construction of its interior, which will include both steeply raked theater seating and cabaret seating, for a total of 110 seats, and a seated bar concession area, as well as back of stage areas like dressing rooms and box office. The estimated budget to complete the interior is \$1.5 million. MetroStage is offering a variety of naming opportunities, ranging in price from \$2,500 to name a seat or a step and increasing from there to include everything from the elevator to the grand staircase.

Metrostage was founded in 1984 to provide Alexandria with professional theater performances, and has staged plays and musicals in a variety of storefronts and warehouses. This will be the first location specifically designed to house the theater as a permanent performing arts venue. Its new space, enclosed in glass on three sides, with a well-lit concourse, marquee, and art display will be a striking addition to the Old Town North streetscape.
